Featured Speaker: Brian Willson



Brian Willson is a Viet Nam veteran whose wartime experiences transformed him into a human rights activist. He gained renown as a participant in the 1986 veterans fast on the steps of the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C. On September 1, 1987, he was run over by a U.S. Navy Munitions train while engaging in a nonviolent protest of weapons shipments to El Salvador. Since the 1980s he has continued efforts to educate the public about U.S. imperialism while striving to "walk his talk" on two prosthetic legs and a three-wheeled handcycle. His book, Blood on the Tracks: The Life And Times of S. Brian Willson documents his journey from high school athlete and Viet Nam commander to handcycling peace activist and writer.

We will also remember the life and work of <u>Dennis Livingston</u> who was a local community activist and artist. He was a pioneer in Baltimore urban renewal, affordable housing, and jobs creation projects. He was passionate about creating healthy communities and fought for the rights of the economically disadvantaged. He and his partner also created a community art gallery and meeting place, the Cork Factory in Greenmount West. He will be sorely missed.
